

## Applied ARTS Studio Courses

Taking 3.0 credits worth of classes on this list is 1 of 4 possible ways to satisfy the 3.0 credit ARTS requirement for any student following the Integrative Liberal Studies Program (ILS). Students can also take ARTS 310, or ARTS 322, 323, or 324, or any ILSA course either in a Topical Cluster or cross listed with departments as ILSA/ARTS courses. Any and all of these can satisfy the 3.0 credits of the Arts Requirement.

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**Arts (3 hrs)** The Arts requirement features courses in which students become intellectually engaged with the arts. They consider the significance and communicative functions of the arts in human experience, the cultural context of creative composition and performance and the foundations of aesthetic values. All UNCA students must take 3 hours of approved Arts coursework.

These courses can be found in the ARTS course listings (Arts 310) or located in other departments and identified with the ARTS or CL#A Prefix before the course title.

**Note to students still fulfilling the old General Education requirements:** Any student who is still following the old General Education program must take ARTS 310 for 3.0 credits + 1.0 credit of an Arts Lab in a topic outside of the student's major. Any of the courses listed above can count towards this 1.0 credit ARTS Lab requirement. However, there are many other classes not listed above where students are creating art during the majority of the class time, and so satisfies the ARTS Lab. This could be any 1.0 credit or more class in Dance performance, Music performance, Drama performance or design, Visual Art studio, Video production, Multi-media Arts design, etc. See the Arts & Ideas Director, Laura Bond for approval of any more 1.0 credit ARTS Lab classes for students following the old general education guidelines.
